It is a danger to utility companies when undertaking a repair and is unsightly. The notice is to bring this matter to the attention of the public to avoid potential prosecution.

The Town Council owns 5 notice boards around the parish and preference is always given to local events and organisations.

## Winter Fuel Payment Information

New rules for getting Winter Fuel Payments:

Now, you will only get the Winter Fuel Payment if you also receive certain benefits including Pension Credit or Universal Credit. If you are entitled to the payment, you will get a letter in October or November and it is usually paid automatically.

(£200 if you are aged under 80/£300 if you are over 80).
